HASSS's Annual Report 2023

Editor-in-Chief: Prof. Dr. Korakoch Attaviriyanupap

HASSS (former title: Silpakorn University Journal of Social Sciences, Humanities, and Arts) is an open access, double-blinded peer-reviewed journal published by Silpakorn University, Thailand. The main objective of our journal is to provide a forum for researchers in the field of humanities, arts and social sciences to publish their articles. Our mission is to promote awareness of and compatibility with the dynamics of various study areas and to disseminate research work related to art and culture, human beings and society. Since our journal was accepted to be indexed in the Scopus database in 2019, we aim to keep our journal up to international standard via different channels, especially regarding contributions of international authors and reviewers. We also try to improve our English proofreading quality.

The number of submissions to our journal has tremendously increased in the last few years as shown in the first two columns in Table 1. However, in 2023, 790 articles were submitted to *HASSS* which means a slight decrease of 11.53% compared to 2022. In fact, there might rather have been a normal increase instead, if we had not closed our submission systems twice during the year. This was also a part of our policy in order to be able to manage the best quality of all the submitted manuscripts. However, the exact acceptance rate still cannot be calculated since some of them are still in process. We will try to shorten our process time, and when our system is more stable and our editorial team have more capacity, we would be pleased to accept more submissions and increase the number of publications accordingly.

Accepted Submissions in 2021–2023 came from 13 countries as shown in Table 3. Thailand represented the biggest part of total submissions as well as acceptance. The number of submissions from different countries has also increased and the involving countries are expanding positively. Regarding the articles, top 10 articles viewed and downloaded from our official website are listed in Table 4. This also shows the diversity of articles published by *HASSS* both in terms of fields of study as well as origin countries of our authors.




TABLE 1. Annual number of manuscripts accepted and rejected by *HASSS*

TABLE 2. Editorial outcome rates 2021–2023



In 2023, the journal published more articles in each issue to increase the overall number of publications resulting in the publication of 60 articles in total. We welcome international or multi-national, multi-institute and multi-disciplinary manuscripts approaching the following issues: History and Philosophy; Archeology and Anthropology; Language, Linguistics and Literature; Architecture; Education; Communication and Media; Management; Political Science; Social Sciences; and Thai Studies.

Thanks to the Thailand Editorial System (Thai ES) we have used since January 2023 under the sponsorship of the Thai Journal Citation Index Centre (TCI), we were able to get contributions of reviewers from 13 countries including Australia, China, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Norway, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, Singapore, Tanzania, Thailand, United Kingdom, and United States. This can be considered to be another international aspect added to our journal and an indicator of the quality of our reviewing process. The distribution of countries of reviewers in 2023 is shown in Figure 1.

It is obvious that we were able to expand our academic contributions worldwide, in case we add all the countries marked in Figure 1 with those in Figure 2, i. e. countries of submissions, to the countries of contributions we had had in the past two years. In 2023, authors who submitted manuscripts to *HASSS* came from the following 45 countries: Albania, Algeria, Australia, Bangladesh, Canada, China, Egypt, Ethiopia, Ghana, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Italy, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Korea, Kosovo, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, Lithuania, Malaysia, Morocco, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine, Philippines, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Slovakia, Somalia, South Africa, Spain, Taiwan, Thailand, Tunisia, Turkey, Uganda, Ukraine, United Kingdom, and Vietnam.

Besides, we aim to increase our publications about 10 percent.
